One page in particular caught my eye thatndiscussed how play unlocks essential skills: physical, emotional, social, cognitive and creative. Here is a quote from that website about creativity: *"Creativity is how we tell the world about ourselves: we write, tell, perform, composer, and craft our stories. But it's also how we draw connections, make sense of abstract ideas, and test things out. Creative play puts children in charge of exploring ideas, relationships, spaces and problems. It sparks confidence, as they learn to trust their natural curiosity..."* 

I also love this quote from actor John Cleese (view entire clip<u>here</u>): "Nothing will stop you being creative so effectively as the fear of making a mistake. The very essence of playfulness is an openness to anything that may happen. A feeling that whatever happens, is OK."


